

1st - Seating Set-Up: Along with your seating chart, also consider:

- Buddy-Pairs as a natural part of the set-up, and Double-Buddies as a natural set-up for Cooperative Learning
- ✓ Variety of work area options, available for all students:
 - Regular desk with privacy folder screens as a signal of "Student Working," if needed or wanted
 - Quiet table/desk area(s)
 - "Stand-up" desk raised desk for students who need the option to standing while working to alleviate restlessness.
 - Different "chair options" around the room where the children can work regular desk chair, library corner floor cushions, story time armchair and rug area, etc.

2nd - "Chunk & Chew" and Move!


- ✓ The 10-2 Rule: for every 10 minutes of instructions, provide 2 minutes for the students to process or interact with the information.
- ✓ Incorporate embedded movement to the process:
 - Total Class Response such as:
 - "Thumbs Up / Thumbs Down / Thumbs Sideways"
 - o **"4-Corners"**

- o "Parking Lot" 느
- Monitor restlessness and students tuning out:
 - "Quick Write"
 - "Think-Pair-Share"
 - o **"3-2-1**"
- Sometimes you'll just have to Shake My Sillies Out!

3rd - Name Sticks with a Twist - Write each student's name on a popsicle stick or tongue depressor, and then:


- ✓ Give the question and think time *before* pulling a name stick.
- ✓ Have *blanks*ticks = Call on *anyone*, even a "repeat customer!" [... *continued* ...]



- ✓ At times, addition options could be:
 - Phone a Friend (by student pulling another stick)
 - Ask the Audience (The class gives Thumbs Up/Down after the student who was called on gives his/her potential answer.)

4th - "I'm Done" Checklist and Choices

✓ Create a "I'm Done" checklist:



- Create a leveled Choice Chart when students are truly done, and you want to keep them active and engaged with learning while the class is finishing work:
 - GREEN choices: Options for all, perhaps could include:
 - Reading in the Library Corner (and they log this in their Reading portfolio – Read to Self, Read with Buddy).
 - Author Cycle choices
 - YELLOW choices: These could be earned options, such as:
 - $\circ~$ Going to the School Library with a pass
 - $\circ~$ Revisiting a previous Center activity (teacher selected options)
 - Puzzles or Math activity games

5th - Class Names Slips - Having a narrow stack of slips that has your class list of students will come in handy in so many ways.

- ✓ Quick check-off for students turning in office notes.
- Monitoring engagement hands-up, "pats on back," "repeat & add more."
- \checkmark ... Oh, and you can think of so much more! (^_^)
